Lois Nona Greeson Myler - age 85, most recently of Noblesville, Indiana, passed away on May 7, 2023. Funeral services will be held on Friday, June 2, 2023

at 12:30 p.m. at the Grand Blanc Stake Center of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Burial will be at Crestwood Cemetery, Grand Blanc.
