Pat Jr. Brady, age 62 died suddenly on July 10th, 2022 in Nacogdoches, Texas. Pat is survived by his wife Bonnie Brady; daughter Melissa Brady; siblings Don, Barbara, and Carol; niece Jeanette; nephew Eric; son-in-Law Josh; and stepdaughter Ariel. Pat is preceded in death by his son Ryan Russell Brady, and parents Bessie Washam and E. P. Brady.

Pat was born on June 29th, 1960 in Benton, Kentucky. He graduated from Arsenal Technical High School in 1979 in Indianapolis, Indiana. Pat worked at multiple trucking companies including Rush Trucking, J.B. Hunt, and Swift until he eventually worked at Schneider National Trucking with his wife Bonnie Brady until his untimely death.

Pat was a great family man and a loving father. He married Sharon Anderson in 1988 and the couple had two children together Ryan Russell Brady, who died at 17 months, and Melissa Aryn Brady. Sharon and Pat later divorced. He met his future wife Bonnie Kozmer while being her truck driver instructor. They

were a match made in heaven as they shared many of the same interests. Pat and Bonnie were happily married on January 23rd, 2014.

Pat was a fun-loving, active man who loved the outdoors all his life. He was an avid fisherman, hunter, and outdoor survivalist. Pat was someone you could rely on in a natural disaster as he was an expert at living off the land. Pat was the jack of all trades, accomplishing anything he put his mind to. He received his diploma from Stratford Career Institute and Penn Foster Career School as an Electrician, Computer Training, and Electronics Technician. Pat dreamed of moving to Alaska and was planning on mining for gold out west once he retired. Pat loved to collect stamps, coins, comic books, and baseball cards. He taught his daughter Melissa how to find real silver coins, use power tools, and home repair. Pat had a passion for classic cars, and you could find him working on his cars in his free time.

He would give you the shirt off his back if he could. Pat was always joking around and telling hilarious tall tales of his past.
