WWII veteran Paul H. McLean, age 94, passed away peacefully at home on Patriot’s Day, Tuesday September 11, 2018. He was born in Saginaw on August 9, 1924 to Paul E. McLean and Erma (Lashua) McLean. He is survived by his wife of 72 years, Juanita (Bliss) McLean and his children: Michael (Lynne), Dennis (Jane) and Michele (McLean) Arington. He is also survived by 3 grandchildren: Jay Arington, Rachel (McLean) Fountain and Jessica McLean. He was preceded in death by his 2 brothers: Jack McLean and James McLean.

Bud moved to Plymouth, Mi. as a youngster where he later met Juanita, married and lived for 44 years. He proudly served in the U.S Navy for 4 years during WWII on minesweepers in the Pacific theater of war. Returning home he worked as a land surveyor for 30 years, later in a small shop until retirement when he and Juanita moved to his dream log cabin in Lewiston, Mi. Bud loved travel, history, genealogy, poetry and was always an avid reader. In more recent years they relocated to their present home in the railroad town of Durand.
