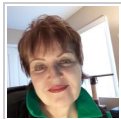

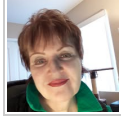
This picture was taken on Tim's 80th birthday. We took a scenic drive through Red Rock Canyon in Las Vegas. He really enjoyed the sites and weather.

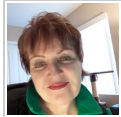
